Where Worker's Compensation and Employment Law Intersects with ADA Returning the Injured Employee Back to Work

Federal and State laws sometimes contradict each other. When that happens, HR & Risk Management can find themselves being pulled down two different procedural paths. Specifically, when an injured employee who is being paid workers' compensation benefits is given return to work restrictions from their medical provider, the North Carolina Workers' Compensation Act & Rules set out a very specific protocol for employers to follow when offering "suitable employment" to their employee – BUT – following that Workers' Comp protocol can lead an employer into a potential head on collision with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) provisions, which require an employer to explore potential "reasonable accommodations" with a disabled employee seeking to return to work.

FAQs

May I purchase access to individual sessions?

No. The series is intentionally provided at a significant value for eight hours of educational sessions and at this reduced rate provides a value whether you attend one session or all eight. Is there an additional fee for payment made using PayPal?
